The Georgetown Public Library makes its pictorial materials widely available while carefully maintaining the physical and intellectual integrity of the historic materials. Patrons are welcome to make reproductions of our collection for personal use. We do ask that patrons comply with the following policies:

- 1. The patron accepts all responsibility for the possible copyright infringement arising from the use of reproductions from the Georgetown Public Library collection.
- 2. Generally, patrons of the Georgetown Public Library may make reproductions of the photographic collection within the Fair Use and other provisions of U.S. Copyright Law. The Georgetown Public Library does not grant or transfer any copyright or other intellectual property rights in the photograph to the patron. Copies in any format MAY NOT be further reproduced, sold, shared, or given to another person, company, or institution for any purpose without written permission from the Library Director.
- 3. Patrons wishing to use Georgetown Public Library photographs or images in a publication must submit a written request to the Library Director for approval.
