An Ordinance Of The City Of Jarrell, Texas, Amending The City Of Jarrell, Texas Code Of Ordinances, Chapter 4, Regarding The Adoption Of The International Building Code, 2018 Edition, The International Residential Code, 2018 Edition, The International Plumbing Code 2018 Edition, International Mechanical Code, 2018 Edition, International Code Council Electrical Code, 2018 Edition, International Fuel Gas Code, 2018 Edition, International Energy Conservation Code, 2018 Edition, International Fire Code, 2018 Edition, International Existing Building Code, 2018 Edition, International Property Maintenance Code, 2018 Edition, International Swimming Pool And Spa Code, 2018 Edition, And The National Electrical Code, 2020 Edition, With Amendments To Meet Local Conditions, And The Penalty Provision; Establishing Penalties Not To Exceed \$2000.00 Per Offense; Providing That This Ordinance Shall Be Cumulative; Repealing All Ordinances To The Extent They Are In Conflict; Providing For Severability; And Providing An Effective Date.

# May is Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month

Former congressional staffer Jeannie Jew began to envision Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month during the 1976 bicentennial celebrations. Her grandfather had worked as part of the large Chinese immigrant group that built the transcontinental railroad, and Ms. Jew desired a way to honor the contributions of Asian and Pacific Islanders to the United States.

After a bill failed to pass in 1977, President Carter signed a joint resolution into law in October 1978. The resolution directed the president to annually issue a proclamation for "Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week," and the first observation began on May 4, 1979. This date was chosen so that the weeklong celebration would include May 10, which marks the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1869.

In 1990, Congress expanded the observance from a week to a month. Two years later, Congress passed the law which permanently designated May as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month. The official name changed in 2009, from Asian Pacific American Heritage Month to Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month. According to the Asian Pacific Institute, the term Asian American Pacific Islander, shortened frequently to AAPI, includes "people of Asian, Asian American or Pacific Islander ancestry, who trace their origins to the countries, states, jurisdictions and/or the diasporic communities of these geographic regions."

During the month of May, the Georgetown Public Library will host two film showings by AAPI directors. On May 7 at 1 p.m. the library will host an all-ages showing of *Shang-Chi and the Legend of the Ten Rings*, rated PG-13. Directed by Destin Daniel Cretton, the film follows Shang-Chi as he confronts his past. It is the first Asian-led movie in the Marvel Cinematic Universe.

Join us for GPL World Cinema on May 11 at 6:30 p.m. to view *Minari*, also PG-13. Lee Isaac Chung wrote and directed this semi-autobiographical drama in which a Korean-American family moves to the Ozarks in search of the American dream. The GPL World Cinema screenings can contain mature themes, events, and language and are recommended for ages 18 and over. Both films are free and open to the public and do not require pre-registration.

Family storytimes during the third week of May will feature books by AAPI authors. Aimed at ages 0-5 years, these storytimes will take place during the mornings of May 18, May 19 and May 20. There are multiple storytimes on Wednesday and Thursday, and all storytimes are the same, so just pick the day and time that work best for you. Additionally, throughout the library patrons will find AAPI themed book displays and lists for children, teens and adults.
