This award-winning documentary follows the soul singer from Grammy nominated R&B band Sharon Jones and the Dap Kings as she records what will be her final album. Popcorn will be provided.

The program finale at 6 p.m. August 8 will be Music Trivia and the prize drawing. Attendees can enjoy snacks and compete as a team or solo in a music trivia game for a chance to win some Summer Reading Program swag and find out who wins the challenge prizes.

We hope you'll consider adding some ideas from our Adult Summer Reading Program to your plans this summer whether you'll be spending time on the beach or on a train, in the library or your favorite reading nook at home.
